

Lieutenant in the Austro-Hungarian army during WWI

Tell me about his brothers and sisters. (name, date of birth and death, occupation, place of residence, family, etc.)

Robert Teltscher: lived in Vienna, emigrated to Palestine with his wife during WWII.

Oskar Teltscher: lived in Vienna, killed during WWII.

Evzen Teltscher: lived in Brno, killed during WWII.

Richard Teltscher: lived in Mikulov, worked in his father's wine-shop, his wife Valerie studied at Vienna University (today Austria) and was active in WIZO in Mikulov; he was a Zionist and member of the Jewish party during the First Czechoslovak Republic, emigrated to Poland, then to England during WWII with his family.

Felix Teltscher: lived in Mikulov, worked in his father's wine-shop, emigrated to England during WWII and stayed there until his death.

Jan Teltscher: lived in Mikulov, worked in his father's wine-shop, emigrated to England during WWII and stayed there until his death.

One was killed during WWI.

One died (no more information)

Brno, Opatija (today Croatia) waiting for the boat to Shanghai for about one month, Shanghai (today China)

Ervin Abelesov: lived in Mikulov, then in Brno, had a glue making company; died in Warsaw (today Poland) during the ghetto uprising.

What sort of education did he have? Elementary school
What sort of work did he do? Owner of a soap and clothes shop, bank clerk
How religious was he? He did not wear a kippah or anything special, his family did not even eat kosher. But they held a Seder on Pesach, he led the Seder, and celebrated Yom Kippur. He went to the synagogue on holidays. He observed the traditional things, but not the formal ones. He did not observe Sabbath.
